**SACRAMENTS**

**The Sacrament of Baptism** is administered most Sundays after the 12:30 pm Mass. Arrangements must be made in advance by calling the Parish Office. First time parents are required to attend a Pre-Jordan class before the baptism. They are held the second Tuesday of every month at 7:30 pm in the Parish Office Conference Room. No pre-registration is necessary.

**The Sacrament of Reconciliation** is offered every Saturday, 4:00 to 4:45 pm and anytime by appointment.

**The Sacrament of Marriage** requires that the couple contact the Church at least 6 months before a planned wedding date. No other arrangements should be made until the couple meets with a parish priest and the date and time are confirmed. One of the couple must be a member of the parish. Attendance at a Pre-Cana marriage preparation program is required in accordance with Archdiocesan policy.

**Anointing of the Sick** is available to the dying and those who are elderly, sick or preparing for surgery. Please contact the Parish Office.

**Communion Calls** are made monthly by clergy and weekly by Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. To place a homebound individual on the Communion Call list, please call the Parish Office.

**NEW REGISTRATIONS**

Welcome new parishioners! You may call the Parish Office at 215-362-7400 to make an appointment to register. In order to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage, or Letters of Eligibility for sponsorship at Baptism or Confirmation, you must be a registered parishioner. Also, children who turn 21 years of age, or complete higher education and continue to reside within our area, should become individually registered parishioners.

## *From Our Pastor*



Dear Parishioners,

By now, you know that the Secretary of Health and Human Services announced last week that the proposed mandate requiring all insurance plans to pay for contraception, sterilization and some abortion drugs is official. Worse, religious groups (no matter their moral principles and beliefs) are not exempt. The only concession to be made is that some religious groups are being allowed an extra year to comply. Timothy M. Dolan, Archbishop of New York, immediately responded to this devastating and frightening news this way: "In effect, the president is saying we have a year to figure out how to violate our consciences." (You can view his full response at the website: [www.usccb.org](http://www.usccb.org)) Yes, beginning August 1<sup>st</sup> of this year, the insurance premiums we pay, including the insurance premiums paid by Catholics for employees of churches and schools, will be used to cover drugs and procedures that are in direct conflict with the teachings of the Church.

We must understand how significant this news is. **Clearly, this decision is a direct attack on religious liberty!** Realize where this is all going. This is frightening! It's a decision with such monumental ramifications that it cannot be ignored nor tolerated. If you agree, please waste no time! Let your elected leaders know that you want religious liberty and rights of conscience restored, and that you want the administration's contraceptive mandate rescinded. Speak out in protest.

## A WORD FROM OUR PARISH NURSE MINISTRY

Eyestrain and eye fatigue can be common among computer users. Computers, however, give off little or no harmful radiation. All levels of radiation from a computer screen are below levels that can cause eye damage such as cataracts. Eyestrain from computers can be caused by bad lighting, how you are sitting at the computer, length of use, and how tired you are. Eyestrain symptoms include sore or irritated eyes, and difficulty focusing. To prevent eyestrain from a computer, position the screen 20-26 inches from your eyes and below eye level. Change light to low glare. Choose screens that tilt. Finally, have your eyes checked regularly by an optometrist.

- Donation to the general Sanctuary Fund or a donation of an item needed for the Sanctuary Fund (some may be memorialized).

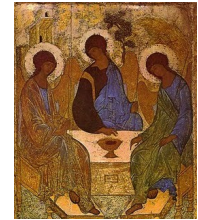

MMR has another first! On January 28<sup>th</sup> MMR students in grades 7 and 8 competed in the Philadelphia Future Cities Competition and received an award for “Most Innovative Transportation Concept”.

- Build a table-top model using recycled materials illustrating one section of the city
