### THIRD GRADE

A booklet composed of numerous handouts was given out to the children as their text. It was offered in two sections. It contained these:

- Family members
- Greetings and commands
- Colors
- Days of the week
- Clock
- Alphabet with sounds of the vowels and phonics
- Days of the week. Months of the year
- Numbers. Telephone numbers. Additions, subtractions, multiplications and divisions.
- Pieces of clothing. Outside garments, too.
- Food items for breakfast, lunch and dinner in a Mexican household.
- Body parts – Contest with Mr. Potato Head.
- Table settings. Food items for breakfast, lunch and dinner.
- Animals (pets), farm animals with bingo and jungle animals with song.
- Means of transportation.
- Reading exercises.
- Spanish names given to all the students.
- Spanish fiestas were celebrated and their culture explained.
- Reading. The children read their book with the correct pronunciation.
- Vocabulary exercises, contests, songs, games and poems that Latin American children know.
- Bingo games, books, movies to reinforce the lessons.
- Movie on the Texas missions and Spanish-speaking Native Americans.
- Activity on the Spanish speaking countries of the Caribbean.(A paper plate map colored by the children).

One of the third grades, Mrs. Iannuzzi's, did a skit in the talent show, in an adaptation of the book I Went Walking.
