SACRAMENTS

The Sacrament of Baptism is administered most Sundays after the 12:30 pm Mass. Arrangements must be made in advance by calling the Parish Office. First time parents are required to attend a Pre-Jordan class before the baptism. They are held the second Tuesday of every month at 7:30 pm in the Parish Conference Room. No pre-registration is necessary.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered every Saturday, 4:00 to 4:45 pm and anytime by appointment.

The Sacrament of Marriage requires that the couple contact the Church at least 6 months before a planned wedding date. No other arrangements should be made until the couple meets with a parish priest and the date and time are confirmed. One of the couple must be a member of the parish. Attendance at a Pre-Cana marriage preparation program is required in accordance with Archdiocesan policy.

Anointing of the Sick is available to the dying and those who are elderly, sick or preparing for surgery. Please contact the Parish Office.

Communion Calls are made monthly by clergy and weekly by Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. To place a homebound individual on the Communion Call list, please call the Parish Office.

NEW REGISTRATIONS

If you are new to the area remember to register to become an MMR parishioner. In order to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Communion, Confirmation and Matrimony, or Letters of Eligibility for sponsorship at Baptism or Confirmation, you must be a registered parishioner. You may call the Parish Office at 215-362-7400 to make an appointment to register. (Please remember that children who turn 21 years of age or complete higher education and continue to reside within our area, should call the Parish Office to become individually registered parishioners of MMR.)

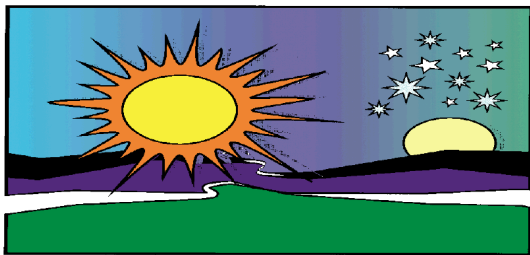

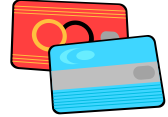

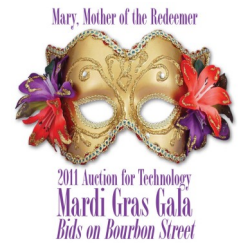

UNDERSTANDING THE REVISED MASS TEXTS (6 of 11)

New Words: A Deeper Meaning, but the Same Mass



THE INSTITUTION NARRATIVE

The “Institution Narrative” is that part of the Eucharistic Prayer when the priest repeats the words of Jesus from the Last Supper. This is a critical part of Mass, very dear to the heart of Catholics. In fact, usually you can hear the congregation become more attentive as the priest speaks the words of Christ, lifts the consecrated bread and wine, and genuflects in adoration.

Beginning on the 1st Sunday of Advent (November 27th), some of the words you will hear in the Institution Narrative will change. Notice what the priest will say as he picks up the bread. The changes in translation are in **bold** print.

*Take this, all of you, and eat **of it, for** this is my Body, which will be given up for you.*

The only difference is the insertion of the words “of” and “for”. The meaning is basically the same, but the new translation expresses the fact that we all share some “of” the same bread. By partaking of one bread, we become one body in Christ. Furthermore, the reason we share this food is because it is the Body of Christ, given up for us. The word “for” draws out this purpose.

There are more differences in the new translation when the priest repeats the words of Christ concerning the chalice of wine. You will notice the word “chalice” instead of “cup”. This matches our common way of referring to the vessel on the altar; it highlights the ceremonial use of the vessel even at the Last Supper; and it matches the frequent appearances of the word “chalice” in the Bible.

*Take this, all of you, and drink from it, **for** this is the **chalice** of my Blood, the Blood of the new and **eternal** covenant, **which** will be **poured out** for you and for **many for the forgiveness of sins**. Do this in memory of me.*

In English, the word “everlasting” (currently used) means something like “long-lasting”. “Eternal” is beyond any possible measurement of time. Regarding the verb “poured out” replacing the verb “shed,” the **new** verb has a more active quality to it. Jesus did not merely shed blood at the infliction of his wounds; he poured out his blood for us. The Passion is not just something that happened to Jesus, but something he freely chose to undergo.

Finally, you’ll notice the change from using the word “all” to the word “many”. To some, the new translation will make it sound as though Jesus has had second thoughts about just who and how many would be redeemed. After all, it is clear from several places in the New Testament that Jesus came for the salvation of all. Nonetheless, the word in Latin literally means “many”, and this is the word that Jesus himself used at the Last Supper, according to Matthew 26:28 and Mark 14:24.

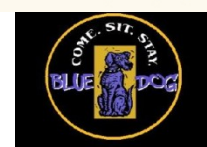
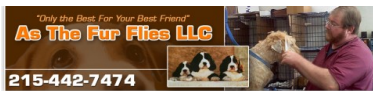
